

Basic services for safe migration

Assaman Nepal, a local partner for the project, has been engaged in Kakarbhitta and Birgunj Ground Crossing Points (GCPs) to provide safe and regular crossing for migrants amid COVID-19 through the 'Effective case management by strengthening isolation centers and ground crossing points management for rapid response and preparedness against COVID-19' project. The project has been implemented by the International Organization for Migration, with the financial support from the European Union European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations and in implementing partnership with the Save the Children.

'To facilitate the movement for migrants, dissemination of various security-related information, comprehensive crowd management approaches and establishments of safe waiting space for migrants have been arranged. In coordination with the health desks and municipalities, the project has supported in health-related services, and provisioned for WASH and protection related services.
